

STANDARDISED PRICE LIST

All funeral directors are legally required to publish this Price List for a standardised set of products and services. This is to help you think through your options and make choices, and to let you compare prices between different funeral directors (because prices can vary as can the services they provide).

Attended Funeral

£3,136.00

(funeral director's charges only)

This is a funeral where family and friends have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person at the same time as they attend their burial or cremation.

Taking care of all necessary legal and administrative arrangements and offering you the choice of meeting in branch, or your own home or online/by phone, with follow-up meetings as required. **£1,495**

Collecting and transporting the deceased person from the place of death (normally within 30 running miles of the funeral director's premises) into the funeral director's care. **£265**

Care of the deceased person before the funeral in appropriate facilities. The deceased person will be kept at our head office facilities, 589 Lanark Road, Edinburgh then conveyed to one of our funeral homes you have chosen. **£425**

Providing a suitable coffin – this will be made from real wood veneer with alternative options also available. **£455**

Viewing of the deceased person for family and friends, by appointment with the funeral director (where viewing is requested by the customer). **£1**

By law a fee is listed but we do not charge for viewing within office hours.

At a date and time you agree with the funeral director, taking the deceased person direct to the agreed cemetery or crematorium (normally within 30 running miles of the funeral director's premises) in a hearse or other appropriate vehicle including funeral director for supervision and all necessary support staff. **£495**

Unattended Funeral

This is a funeral where family and friends may choose to have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person, but they do not attend the burial or cremation itself.

Burial

(funeral director's charges only) **£2,495**

Cremation

(funeral director's charges plus the cremation fee)² **£1,790**

Fees You Must Pay

Burial

For an Attended or Unattended burial funeral, the burial fee:¹ **£771.54 to £1,322**

In this local area, the typical cost of the burial fee for local residents is: **£1,322**

For a new grave, you will also need to pay for the plot; for an existing grave with a memorial in place, you may need to pay a removal/replacement fee. In addition, the cemetery may charge a number of other fees.

Cremation

For an Attended cremation funeral, the cremation fee:² **£859 to £995**

In this local area, the typical cost of a cremation for local residents is: **£859**

Additional Funeral Director Products And Services

The funeral director can give you a full list of what they can supply. They are likely to charge for these additional products and services, so you may choose to take care of some arrangements without their involvement, or you can use a different supplier.

This funeral director may be able to supply a range of optional, additional products and services, or to arrange (on your behalf) for a third party to supply them.

Additional mileage (price per mile) **£1.75**

Supply of limousine within a 30 running mile radius **£295**

Additional transfers of the deceased person's body (e.g. to their home, to a place of worship etc.) (price per transfer) **£195 to £375**

Collection and delivery of ashes (No charge for local delivery but by law we have to list a cost) **£1**

Embalming **From £150 to £295**

Funeral officiant (e.g. celebrant, minister of religion etc.) **Price on request**

Services supplied outside of normal office hours **Price on request**

¹ This fee (which is sometimes called the interment fee) is the charge made for digging and closing a new grave, or for reopening and closing an existing grave.

² In England, Wales and Northern Ireland, you will usually need to pay doctors' fees as well. This is the charge for two doctors to sign the Medical Certificates for Cremation.
